



The Case House

The Case house was moved from its original site in the Salem District, just southeast of Portage la Prairie, to the Fort la Reine Museum in February 2000.

The home was built by John Bannerman, around 1922, and it has had several residents over the years. Mr. Bannerman was its first occupant, and then Stan and Ruth Case lived in the house from 1926 to 1930-31 until they bought a farm a few miles to the south. For the next fourteen years the Delesky family lived in the house. In 1945 Stan and Ruth Case bought the farm and lived there until 1981. The Case Family were the donors of the home.

The house is very typical of many farm homes throughout rural Manitoba. It measures 32' x 32' and has two full floors with kitchen, dining room, living room on the main floor; four bedrooms upstairs, as well as a bathroom and a closed-in rear facing balcony on the second floor; plus an unfinished attic. Renovations are required to the home before it is opened to the public.
