

The Douglas Campbell House

This house was moved to the Fort la Reine Museum site from the original homestead of the Douglas L. Campbell family at Flee Island, 15 miles northeast of Portage la Prairie. It was named “Century Farm” in 1980 by the

Government of Manitoba under Premier Sterling Lyon.

Built prior to 1890, this is the house in which Douglas Campbell grew up and continued to call home throughout his political career.

Douglas Campbell served as Premier of Manitoba from 1948 to 1958. He was elected as the MLA for Lakeside constituency

in 1922 and retired prior to the provincial election of 1969. His 47 years of continuous political service to the province is a Canadian Record and among the longest parliamentary records in the Commonwealth. The house is currently undergoing restoration.
